

Cost-Of-Living City Comparison

Thinking of relocating to the Phoenix or Tucson areas? Well, here's some good news. If you compare the cost-of-living* between several major U.S. cities to Phoenix or Tucson, you better start packing your bags and head to the Grand Canyon State. Out of 17 cities reviewed, Phoenix and Tucson came out on top as more affordable places to live. For example, if you moved from Los Angeles, California to Phoenix, Arizona your cost of living would decrease by approximately 29%.

These indexes cover housing, food, clothing, transportation, health care, utilities and miscellaneous goods and services, and are based on a national average of 100.
